- Canadian geography (1 credit-Grade 9)
- Canadian history (1 credit-Grade 10)
- The arts (1 credit)
- Health and physical education (1 credit)
- Civics (1/2 credit-Grade 10) Careers (1/2 credit-Grade 10)
- One credit from each of the group selections listed below


Preparing for College

College programs require only the prerequisites for the program




Example -Practical Nursing diploma

2 credits ($\frac{1}{2}$ day) in a work placement off of school property. In grade 12 you are eligible for 4 credits (full day co-op)

Helps you to decide what you want to do

Gives you experience needed for some post-secondary programs (concurrent teaching, social services etc.)

Start banking Apprenticeship hours - OYAP Program (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program)




