Secondary School Diploma Requirements

Ontario Secondary School Diploma Requirements

- English (4 credits one credit per grade)
- Mathematics (3 credits, with at least one in Grade 11 or 12)
- Science (2 credits)
- French as a second language (1 credit)
- Canadian geography (1 credit-Grade 9)
- Canadian history (1 credit-Grade 10)
- The arts (1 credit)
- Health and physical education (1 credit)
- Civics (1/2 credit-Grade 10) Careers (1/2 credit-Grade 10)
- One credit from each of the group selections listed below

One of the following choices (Group 1):

Additional English, or French Religion Counts!! Native language, or a classical or an international language, or Grade 11 Religion Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, co Gradve education.



Are abstract, reflective learners


Can work independently

Typically bound for university








APPLIED COURSES Grade 10

Best for students who:


- Learn by doing

Locally- Developed Grades 9 & 10

Best for students who:

- Small Teacher: Student ratio
- Slower Pace
- Learn by doing
- Require additional support in the classroom
- Typically bound for work or trades
