4 credits in English (one credit per grade)
3 credits in math (at least 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
2 credits in science

• 1 credit in French

- 1 credit in Canadian history

  - 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
  - .5 credit in civics
  - .5 credit in career studies

#### PLUS

- Optional Courses (12) includes 4 Religion
- 40 hours of Community Service
- Successful completion of the Grade 10 Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test





#### Literacy Test – March 2019

- Another chance to write test will be given
  - OR you could take the literacy course
- Student must pass test OR course to graduate



- Min averages for many programs ... check guide at <u>www.electronicinfo.ca</u>
- Plan your grade 11 AND 12 years now to ensure you will meet your post secondary requirements

#### Plan Ahead – Trades/Apprenticeship Bound

- Check recommended courses and # of hours required
- www.careersintrades.com
- www.apprenticesearch.com
- Combine COOP credits plus OYAP and start earning hours toward your apprenticeship while still in high school

#### Plan Ahead – College Bound

- Check program prerequisites and min averages for competitive programs

- Min 65% average
