- Science (2 credits)

- Canadian history (1 credit-Grade 10)
- The arts (1 credit)
- Health and physical education (1 credit)
- Civics (1/2 credit-Grade 10) Careers (1/2 credit-Grade 10)
- One credit from each of the group selections listed below

	<p><u>Online Learning</u></p> <p>You must earn at least two online (E-Learning) credits in order to graduate.</p>

Selections

- ▶ Remember: Grade 10 Students must pick 8 courses and an alternate. Grade 11 students must pick at least 6 courses
- ▶ Grade 10s have 6 compulsory courses and 2 electives
- ▶ Grade 11s have 3 compulsory courses and 5 electives – electives are determined by your future pathway.

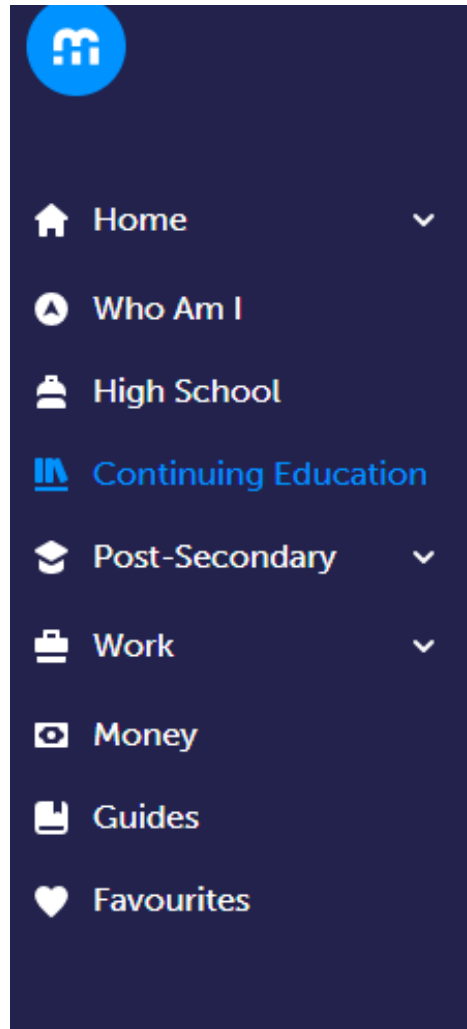

Night School

- ▶ There is an option to choose a night school credit for next year through my blueprint as well.
- ▶ Under the continuing education tab there is an option for night school - grades 9-12.
- ▶ These classes take place during the school year and are online and asynchronous and would be completed at night. These courses do not replace one of your day school classes but could be used if you are behind a credit.
- ▶ Options are: Travel and Tourism, Ontario Literacy course and credit recovery.

Making Choices

- ▶ Pick your 8 choices - Remember to check that you have completed compulsory courses.
- ▶ Choose an Elective you would be happy to take (we will substitute this if there is a conflict with your first 8 choices)
- ▶ Choose all courses wisely - changes are not always possible
- ▶ Choose summer school if desired
- ▶ Once you have chosen click Review courses

- ▶ When you click submit (courses are locked in) - you will be prompted for a parent email address - EMAIL must match the one on record at the school
- ▶ Parents will receive an email listing your choices and must click accept to approve selections
- ▶ Activity fee of \$40 and forms must be signed on SchoolCash online

- ▶ MyBlueprint is open now
- ▶ Course selections should be approved by a parent by **Feb. 23rd**
- ▶ MyBlueprint is our course selection tool. MyBlueprint is only updated periodically, it does not always register courses taken in another board.
- ▶ Want to take an online course during the school year look under online offerings.
