Applying to University













Step 1: Research Your University Options

- Visit OUInfo (<u>www.ouinfo.ca</u>) to find what each university has to offer.
- Read the Undergraduate Application Guide (available at <u>www.ouac.on.ca/undergrad-guide</u>) for up-to-date information about universities and programs.
- Check out university publications and websites.
- Talk to counsellors, family, teachers and friends.
- Write down your program choices and codes and keep them handy.

Step 2: Get Your OEN

You will need your Ontario Education Number (OEN) to apply.


You can find your OEN on your **report card**. It was also on your **timetable** that was emailed to you at the beginning of the semester. Your high school guidance counsellor will also have it on record.

Step 3: Mark Your Calendar

- October 14-17, 2025 University Regional Fairs At Western, Brock, Waterloo For specific dates see https://www.ouevents.ca/regional/#southwestern
- January 15, 2026: Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.
- May 28, 2026: Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.
- June 1, 2026: The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit).

Main Campus

Learn about our admission requirements for Ontario High school students before you apply.

- We will acknowledge receipt of your application by email within one week.
- Save this email because it contains your student number and login information to access the uoZone student portal. Keep an eye on your junk mail folder just in case.
- Once you have received your login information, you can consult your 'Admission File' to see what documents you will need to submit to the University of Ottawa.

We offer a CO-OP option for many of our undergraduate programs. If you're interested in CO-OP, select "Yes" for it when you apply. If you are not accepted into CO-OP, we will consider you for the regular program without it.

Please note that CO-OP is only available for programs that you start in September.

All our undergraduate programs take four years to complete unless specified otherwise.



Order Your Choices




You can expect to receive an offer of admission to only 1 program. Your highest choice listed for Brock is considered first when more than 1 Brock program is indicated on your application. If you are not eligible for the first choice, consideration will be given to subsequent choices in the order of preference you indicated. If you apply to only 1 Brock program and do not qualify, in most cases, consideration will be given for an alternative and related program. In most cases if you apply for, but are not admitted to a co-op program, you will automatically be considered for the regular, non co-op program.


Rank: If you apply to more than 1 program at the University of Guelph and you have never attended a postsecondary institution, you will be considered for all programs to which you've applied.










- On the Complete page, print the screen displaying your OUAC Reference Number (2024-XXXXXX) and instructions. You will also receive an email.
- Record your OUAC Reference Number, as you will need to include it when communicating with the OUAC and the universities.




