17 COMPULSORY CREDITS	13 OPTIONAL CREDITS
<p>You need the following 17 compulsory credits to get your OSSD:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade) • 3 credits in mathematics (Grade 9, Grade 10 and 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12) • 2 credits in science • 1 credit in technological education (Gr. 9 or Gr.10) • 1 credit in Canadian history (Gr. 10) • 1 credit in Canadian geography (Gr. 9) • 1 credit in the arts • 1 credit in health and physical education • 1 credit in French as a second language • 0.5 credit in career studies • 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship • 1 credit from the STEM-related course group <p>STEM-related course group Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the following group:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • business studies • computer studies • cooperative education • mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required) • science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required) • technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 Religion credits 1/year • The other 9 can be anything you like! <p>Note: If you plan to go to University, you will need to research what the Gr 12 course requirements are for your chosen program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You will need 6 courses that end in "4U or 4M" in order to apply to University. <p>If you plan to go to College, you will need to research what the Gr 12 course requirements are for your chosen program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Programs differ in the courses they need. <p>OTHER REQUIREMENTS TO GRADUATE</p> <p><u>Literacy Requirement</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Literacy test generally written in Gr. 10 • Can also take a course if not successful on test <p><u>Volunteer Hours</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You need 40 hours (you can do more!) • Must be for a Not For Profit Organization • Not a job that someone would usually be paid for <p><u>Online Learning</u></p> <p>You must earn at least two online (E-Learning) credits in order to graduate.</p>

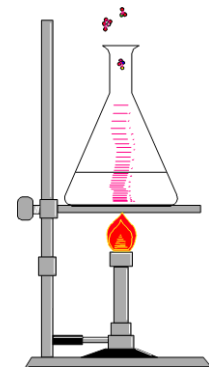
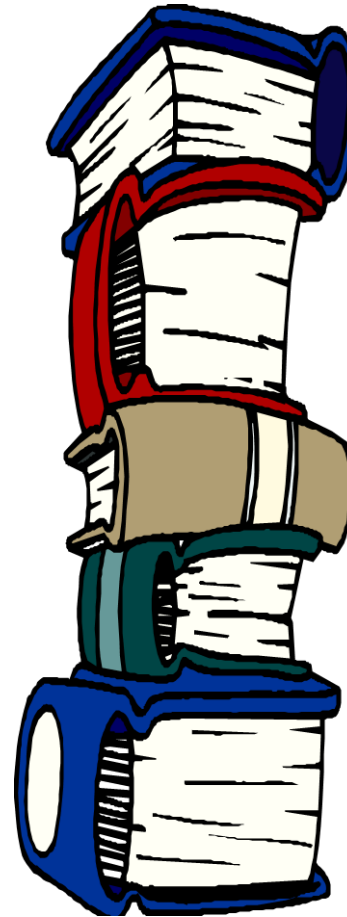

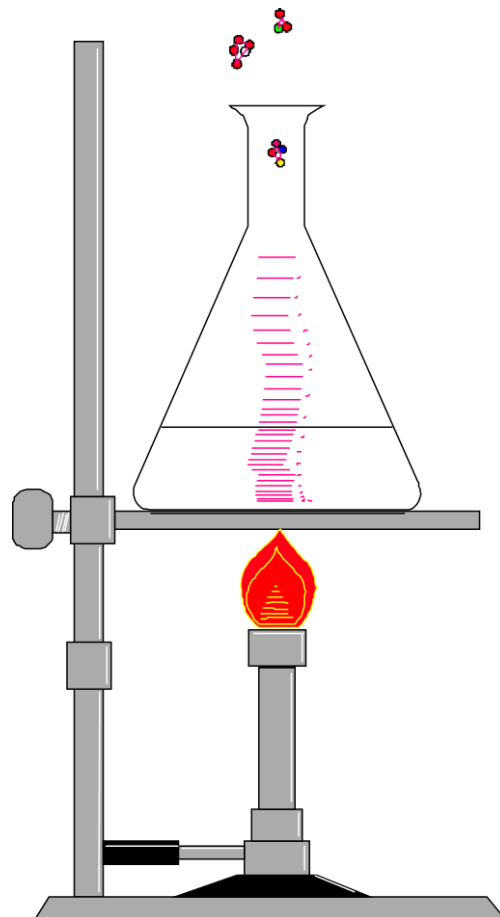

Best for students who:

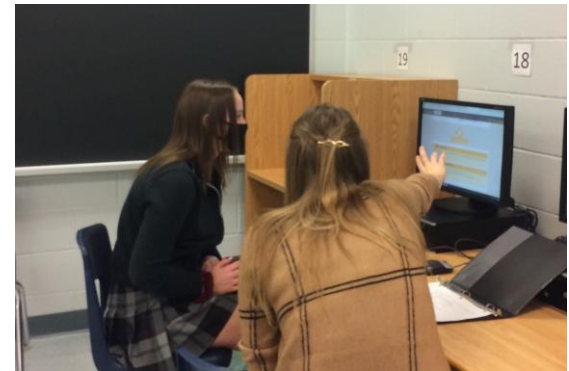
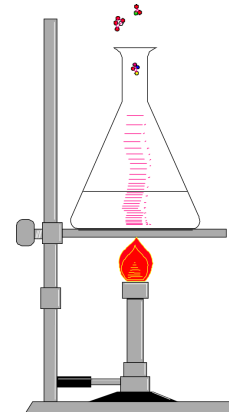
- Learn by doing

- Small Teacher: Student ratio
- Slower Pace
- Learn by doing
- Require additional support in the classroom
- Typically bound for work or trades



HOW DO I CHOOSE THE RIGHT LEVEL?

- * Evaluate your grade 9 success
- * Begin researching post-secondary destinations (WEBSITES at the end) to see which level of education is required.
- * Evaluate your work habits and effort
- * Listen to teacher recommendations

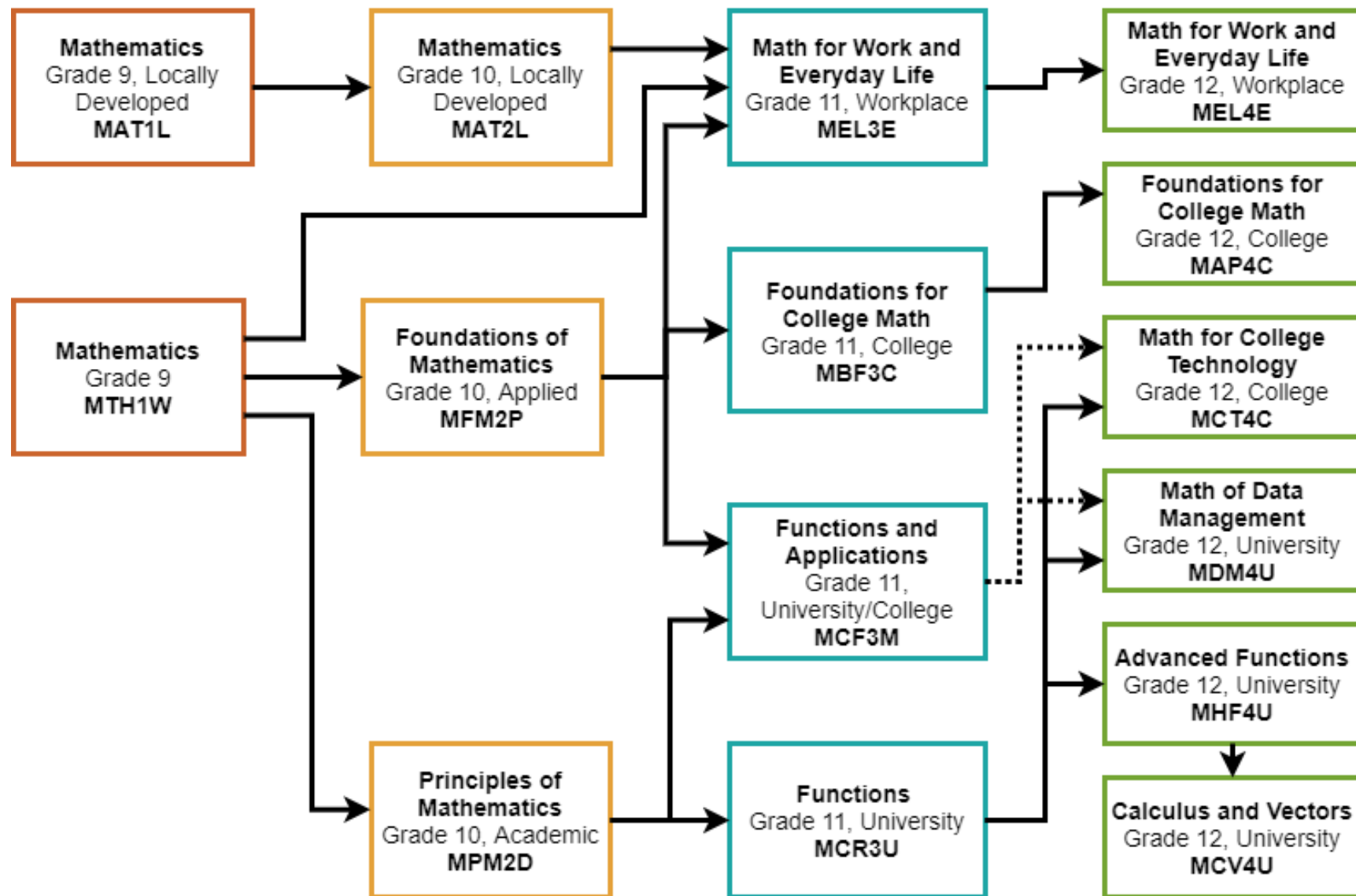

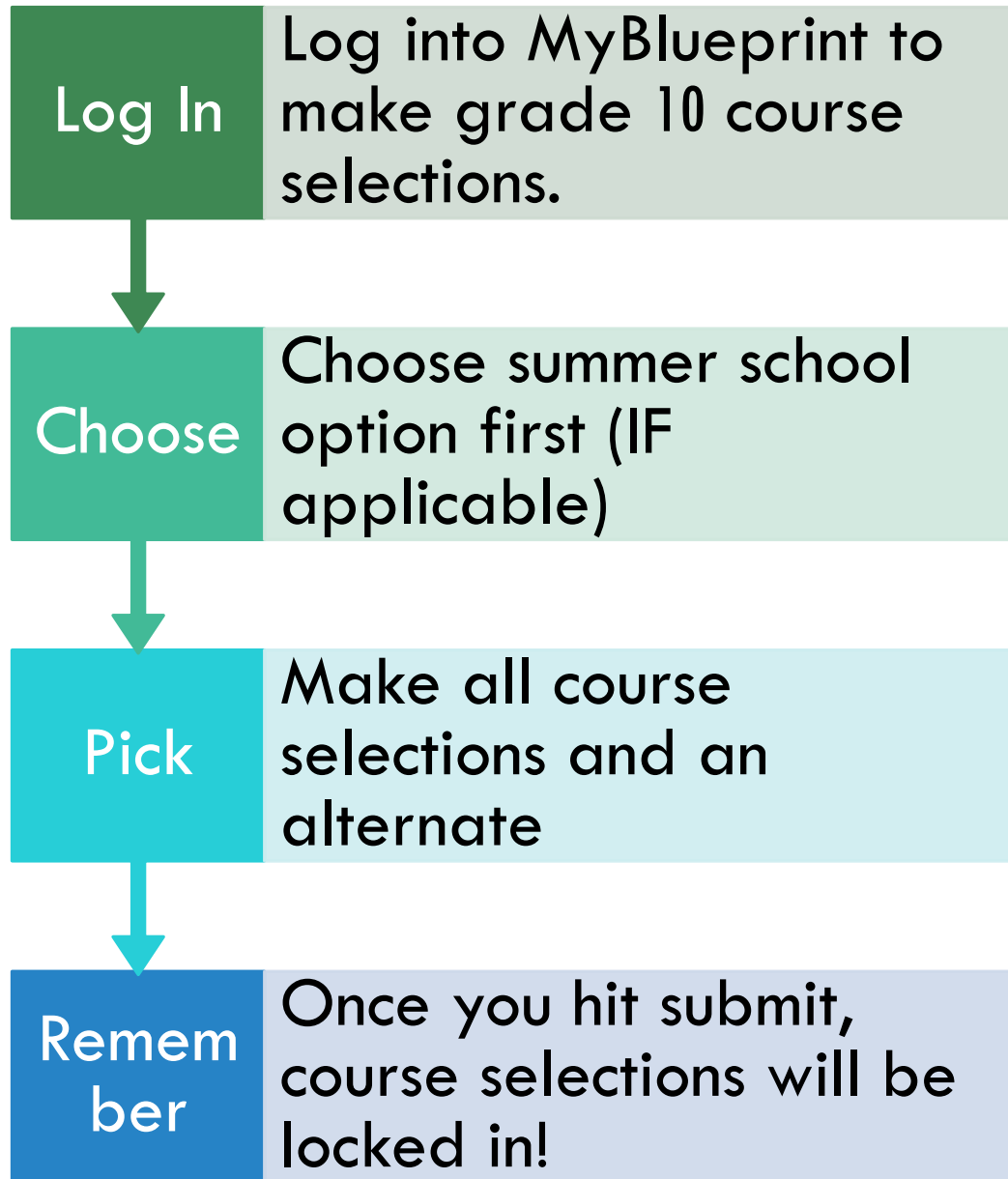
