# DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

TOTAL CREDITS NECESSARY: 30	
17 COMPULSORY CREDITS	13 OPTIONAL CREDITS
<p>You need the following 17 compulsory credits to get your OSSD:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)</li><li>• 3 credits in mathematics (Grade 9, Grade 10 and 1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)</li><li>• 2 credits in science</li><li>• 1 credit in technological education (Gr. 9 or Gr.10)</li><li>• 1 credit in Canadian history (Gr. 10)</li><li>• 1 credit in Canadian geography (Gr. 9)</li><li>• 1 credit in the arts</li><li>• 1 credit in health and physical education</li><li>• 1 credit in French as a second language</li><li>• 0.5 credit in career studies</li><li>• 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship</li><li>• 1 credit from the <a href="#">STEM-related course group</a></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 4 Religion credits 1/year</li><li>• The other 9 can be anything you like!</li></ul> <p><b>Note:</b> If you plan to go to University, you will need to research what the Gr 12 course requirements are for your chosen program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• You will need 6 courses that end in "4U" or "4M" in order to apply to University.</li></ul> <p>If you plan to go to College, you will need to research what the Gr 12 course requirements are for your chosen program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Programs differ in the courses they need.</li></ul>
OTHER REQUIREMENTS TO GRADUATE	
<p><b>STEM-related course group</b> Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the following group:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• business studies</li><li>• computer studies</li><li>• cooperative education</li><li>• mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)</li><li>• science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)</li><li>• technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)</li></ul>	<p><b>Literacy Requirement</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Literacy test generally written in Gr. 10</li><li>• Can also take a course if not successful on test</li></ul> <p><b>Volunteer Hours</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• You need 40 hours (you can do more!)</li><li>• Must be for a Not For Profit Organization</li><li>• Not a job that someone would usually be paid for</li></ul> <p><b>Online Learning</b></p> <p>You must earn at least two online (E-Learning) credits in order to graduate.</p>

- Typically bound for college, trades or work






# Locally- Developed Grades 9 & 10

- \* Evaluate your work habits and effort

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

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


