#### Graduation 2017

Graduation 2017 is quickly approaching! By now the following things should be completed:

1.Registered in Moodle for participation at Graduation

2.Graduation fee paid (\$75)

3.Community Service Hours Completed and Submitted to Student Services

4.Application for Titan and School Letter Submitted to Main Office (optional)

5.Applications for Scholarships, Bursaries, and Certificates submitted to Student Services (optional) www.trinitycatholic.ca/page/financing-your-education-o

Graduation invitations and information packages will be mailed home in early May. Any student who has not completed the above tasks (1,2,3) will not receive an invitation to graduation until they are completed. Each family will be provided 4 passes for graduation. Seating is limited. The graduates do not require a pass. If your family requires an additional pass, please contact Michele Burnie in the Student Services Office to have your name added to the waiting list. If you do not require all 4 passes, please return them to Student Services so they can be distributed to families in need. If you have any questions or concerns regarding graduation for your child, please contact their Guidance Counsellor.

#### **GUIDANCE NEWS**

A Message for our Grade 12's - Midterm marks have been submitted to both the Ontario College Application Services (OCAS) and the Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC). Students need to review their applications to ensure courses and marks listed are correct. Any problems should be *immediately* brought to the attention of the Guidance Department. Please note that community service hours are required as part of the diploma requirements for graduation and therefore essential for acceptance to college, university or work.

Just a reminder that the deadline to respond to a university acceptance is June 1, 2017. Responses to an offer of admission are made through www.ouac.on.ca . College applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by May  $1^{st}$ , 2017 through ontariocolleges.ca.

Please have your child inform Student Services when they have confirmed their acceptance to a college, university, employer or apprenticeship program so that we may share their future plans on the bulletin board located outside of Student Services. We also need this information for the creation of a power point presentation to be delivered at the graduation ceremonies.

The Ontario Student Assistance Plan web application will be available in May. The website is osap.gov.on.ca.

Summer school forms are available in student services. The BHNCDSB is offering a two credit coop which will consist of a 20 hour pre-orientation requirement to be held at St. Mary's Learning Centre in Brantford on two Saturdays and Mondays after school in June. The placement component is tentatively set to run from July 4th to August 11<sup>th</sup>. Our board is also offering Gr. 12U English, Gr 11M Religion and Gr 10 Careers & Civics. Courses are on-line and must be completed in the month of July. GEDSB is also offering many summer school courses available to our students.

Please encourage your child to complete their 40 hours of community service hours as early as possible in their high school career. There are always advantages and personal satisfaction to doing more than 40 hours of community service. Your child may also be interested in applying for the Titan Award or School Letter – packages are available in Student Services and on our website www.trinitycatholic.ca.
