Graduation 2018 is quickly approaching! By now the following things should be completed:

 4. Application for Titan and School Letter Submitted to Main Office (optional)
 5. Applications for Scholarships, Bursaries, and Certificates submitted to Student Services (optional)

Graduation invitations and information packages will be mailed home in early May. Any student who has not completed the above tasks (1,2,3) will not receive an invitation to graduation until they are completed. Each family will be provided 4 passes for graduation. Seating is limited. The graduates do not require a pass. If your family requires an additional pass, please contact Michele Burnie in the Student Services Office to have your name added to the waiting list. If you do not require all 4 passes, please return them to Student Services so they can be distributed to families in need. If you have any questions or concerns regarding graduation for your child, please contact their Guidance Counsellor.

GUIDANCE NEWS

A Message for our Grade 12's - Midterm marks have been submitted to both the Ontario College Application Services (OCAS) and the Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC). Students need to review their applications to ensure courses and marks listed are correct. Any problems should be **immediately** brought to the attention of the Guidance Department. Please note that community service hours are required as part of the diploma requirements for graduation and therefore essential for acceptance to college, university or work.

Just a reminder that the deadline to respond to a college acceptance is **May 1st** and university offers must be confirmed by **June 1st**.

Please have your child inform Guidance when they have confirmed their acceptance to a college, university, employer or apprenticeship program so that we may share their future plans on the bulletin board located outside of Student Services. We also need this information for the creation of a power point presentation to be delivered at the graduation ceremonies.

Guidance hosted an OSAP information night on Wed April 25th. We hope you were able to attend and gather information that can help you access funds to pay for post-secondary education.

Summer school forms are available. The BHNCD SB is offering grade 10 careers and civics, grade 11 World Religion, grade 12 U level English, and a two credit coop. Please see Guidance if you missed registering for these courses and wish to sign up.

Please encourage your child to complete their 40 hours of community service as early as possible in their high school career. There are always advantages and personal satisfaction to doing more than 40 hours of **community service**.

\$\$\$ The Guidance Department hosted a series of workshops on Tuesday April 17th for our grade 12 students. The goal was to help seniors improve their **Financial IQ** and equip them for the financial challenges that will come.
