Superintendent Chopp presented a pictorial overview of the successful fourth annual “Souper Bowl” fundraiser. \$2,834.50 in cash donations and 19,838 cans of soup and non-perishable food items were collected by staff, students and community partners and distributed between the St. Vincent de Paul organizations in Brantford, Simcoe, Caledonia and Dunnville, as well as eight community food banks across Brant, Haldimand and Norfolk. 5.2 Marker School Project

Superintendent Telfer brought trustees up to date on the Marker School Project, which began last year with six schools, and has been expanded to twelve school for 2013-14, representing approximately 60% of all elementary students. She explained that each Marker School has selected a specific focus in the areas of mathematics or literacy, and has identified key strategies and instructional tools to address the identified learning needs of their students. Focused monitoring, regular teacher collaboration, and ongoing sharing of best practices and experiences with administrators across the system are key components of this initiative. Superintendent Telfer introduced Don Backus (Principal), Bill Acres (Vice Principal), Julie Long and Shawn Weiler (Grades 5/6 teachers) from St. Joseph's school; as well as Neil Chopp (Principal), Janine Fedeiruk (Gr. 6/7 teacher) and Emily Huculak (Gr. 1 /2 teacher) from Holy Cross School who provided an overview of the specific foci they are working on, and shared their experiences, student growth, success stories and challenges. Discussion ensued and trustee inquiries in the areas of student feedback, measuring improved student achievement, diagnostic assessments, and next steps were addressed by school and Board staff. Trustee Dignard congratulated everyone involved in the Marker School Project for their outstanding work and Chair Szeman expressed the Board's appreciation to the presenters for their informative presentations.

5.1 Primary Core French as a Second Language Update

Superintendent Telfer provided an update on the first year implementation of teaching Core French in Grades 1-3. Based on the positive feedback received from teachers and students in the seven schools piloting the program, and in support of the new *Call to Action* program, a Framework for French as a Second Language in Ontario Schools, the goal is to increase the number of schools from seven to possibly fourteen schools in 2014-15, depending on staff scheduling and school organizations. In response to trustee inquiries, Superintendent Telfer advised that the program is offered through prep time four times in a 5-day cycle in 50-minute blocks and confirmed that the program represents no additional cost to the Board.

DUAL CREDIT PROGRAMS

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Through the Student Success Initiative, the Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board is offering expanded programs to help meet students' individual learning styles and interests. These programs allow students to customize their high school experience through a variety of new and enhanced learning options, which include Dual Credits, Specialist High Skills Majors, and Cooperative Education. These programs help students meet their needs, interests, and strengths while engaging them in learning to better prepare them for graduation and post-graduation opportunities.

Dual Credit Programs support a number of students who graduate from secondary school and provide a seamless transition to post-secondary education. Assumption College School, Holy Trinity Catholic High School and St. John's College are currently taking advantage of several dual credit programs. These programs provide students the opportunity to take college or apprenticeship courses that count towards the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), as well as a post-secondary certificate, diploma, degree or a Certificate of Apprenticeship.

DEVELOPMENTS:

Existing Dual Credit Opportunities

1. **School Within a College (SWAC)** offers secondary students the opportunity to engage in a dual credit or apprenticeship based on a pathway choice. In this program, students take both college courses and high school courses while spending full days in a college setting. The programs are offered through Mohawk College and Fanshawe College.
2. **Accelerated Ontario Apprenticeship Program (AOYAP)** provides students the opportunity to include 'trade school curriculum' in their program, along with the cooperative education credits. These credits are delivered outside the regular school day at Assumption College School and at St. John's College.
3. **Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)** allows students to focus on a career path matching skills and interests while meeting requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Students receive the SHSM seal on their diploma when they complete a bundle of eight to ten courses related to a specific economic sector. Programs are offered at all three secondary schools.

New Dual Credit Opportunities

Team Taught Dual Credits were recently introduced at all three secondary schools. Both a college and high school faculty teach course content at the same time at a secondary school location. Students earn a credit, which counts towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), as well as a college credit.

STUDENT TRUSTEE REPORT

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Student Senate met on April 15, 2014

DEVELOPMENTS:

At the April 15, 2014 Senate meeting, Senators discussed a variety of topics. Planning for the May 22, 2014 Student Leadership Symposium continued. The group also discussed the Province Wide Mass, to be held on May 7 during Catholic Education Week. It was decided that a group of students from each of the high schools will meet at a central location, St. Mary Church in Simcoe, to celebrate Mass together. Senators also discussed the upcoming Student Trustee elections to be held on April 29, 2014.

SCHOOL NEWS:

Assumption College School have been focusing mainly on their Lenten project, *A Bed for Every Child*. This campaign is in partnership with the St. Vincent de Paul Society. In an effort to raise awareness and donations, ACS Lions participated in an overnight event called *Assumption Cares*. This was a fun-filled event, and participants slept on the floor of the school to show their support for the campaign. Over \$7,000 in pledges was raised, with more funds being donated by homerooms. As the Lions moves out of the Lenten season, they will be focusing on a number of upcoming events, including a Glow Dance and Battle of the Houses.

St. John's College is currently focusing on elections for their student government. They plan to host a pep rally in the coming weeks, where applicants for the President position will deliver their speeches. The night will also celebrate the spring sports teams. St. John's College has also received a \$500 grant from the DARE program, which they will use to promote healthier lifestyles and to discourage students from using drugs and alcohol. The Eagles are also preparing for their next school dance, a Glow Dance, scheduled for May 7, 2014.

Holy Trinity is also focusing on their Lenten project. Similar to the other two high schools, the Titans are working with the St. Vincent de Paul Society to collect toiletry products that the organization is in need of. Each homeroom has been assigned different items that they are encouraged to bring in, in an effort to provide a diverse selection of toiletries to meet current needs. The Titans are also planning their year-end event, titled *The Event*, scheduled for May 23, 2014; this event will be open to the entire community. In partnership with United Way and the public high school in Simcoe, *The Event* will be modeled after a fair and will include games for children, student performances, and a student art gallery. All proceeds from the event will be donated to United Way.
